## **RULES TO GOVERN THE ASUSBC ANNUAL MEETING**

To the Delegates assembled at the Arkansas State USBC Annual Meeting in Conway, AR:

We, the State Board of Directors, present for your approval for the following rules to govern the 2023 ASUSBC Annual Meeting:

1. Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the procedures at the Annual Meeting, provided they do not conflict with the by-laws of the ASUSBC.
2. Visitors and ASUSBC Members who are not Delegates, shall be seated by the Sergeant-At-Arms in a section other than with the Delegates.
3. Registered Delegates shall check in and present their USBC Card no later than 1:00pm on Saturday, July 29, 2023. All Delegates present shall have voting rights.
4. Delegates shall wear their name tags in full view during the meeting.
5. All motions submitted at the Annual Meeting shall be stated in the affirmative. Proposed amendments contained in the Legislative Committee report do not require a motion or second and the Committee Chair will make a recommendation for or against adoption.
6. At the discretion of the presiding officer, whomever proposes an amendment may be required to submit such amendment in writing, with a copy to the Chair, before or at the time it is proposed from the floor.
7. A Delegate shall be permitted to speak only twice on any question, limiting each discussion to two (2) minutes. Discussion shall be confined strictly to the motion on the floor and all questions and answers shall be directed to the Chair.
8. To be recognized, a Delegate must rise and address the Chair by saying "Mr. or Madam President" or "Mr. or Madam Chairperson". He/she shall clearly state their name in full and the local association they represent.
9. In order to expedite the business of the 2023 ASUSBC Annual Meeting, the Delegates shall give courteous and full attention to the speaker having the floor.
10. No alcoholic beverages may be consumed during the Annual Meeting.
11. Delegates desiring to leave the meeting room shall request permission of the Chair.
12. Exceptions to these rules may be made at the discretion of the President.

ASUSBC 2021 Annual Meeting  
July 30, 2022  
Heifer International Little Rock

President Laura Childress called the 2022 ASUSBC Annual Meeting to order on Saturday, July 30, 2022, at 1:19 PM. Director Sheila Mason gave the invocation and Sgt at Arms Audra Holt led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Association Manager Nancy Burrow gave roll call of officers and directors. Those in attendance were President Laura Childress, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President Dena Bunch, Sgt at Arms Audra Holt, Directors Melissa Landers, Russell Bunch, Trudy Loerzel, Sheila Mason, Steve Botter, Debra Kent, Brenda Dokes, Michael Shirley, and Kelly Stevens. 2<sup>nd</sup> VP Connie Lawrence was absent.

Director Melissa Landers presented the rules of the meeting. Vanessa Burks, Central AR USBC, made a motion to accept the rules of the meeting as presented. Belinda Massey, Tri County USBC, 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion carried.

Sgt at Arms Audra Holt gave the first credentials report, 3 Officers, 9 Directors, 42 Delegates making 54 eligible to vote. 12 guests were in attendance, for a total of 66.

David Fields, USBC Regional Manager, was introduced to the group and gave a presentation covering the 2022 National Convention, Lane Certification changes, SMART, retaining and growing membership, as well as other topics. A video was shown with outtakes of the virtual convention. The group enjoyed the presentation.

President Laura Childress gave her remarks regarding the 2021-22 season and how the Board had worked together to provide quality tournaments for our members. Her full report is included in the packet.

Association Manager Nancy Burrow gave her remarks and started by thanking the ASUSBC Board of Directors for their help and support. She stated her "real" job had not really let up since a computer change in early 2021. That coupled with having a child graduate a move to college a few days before the meeting had been a challenge. Her full report is included in the packet.

President Laura Childress presented the minutes from the 2021 Annual meeting held July 24, 2021, at the Heifer International in Little Rock. Belinda Massey, Tri County USBC, made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Sheila Mason, Tri County USBC, 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. Motion carried.

President Laura Childress announced that we were straying from our agenda to allow Ian Draeger, Tri County USBC, a chance to give his report on JrGold 2022. He stated that it was a great experience. The bowling was not great but all of the activities and other bowlers made it an awesome experience. USBC and the JrGold Facebook page shared a video of Ian singing at an open mic night before the tournament started. The video was played and all delegates and guests gave him a round of applause for his talent and his representation of our state at Jr Gold.

Association Manager Nancy Burrow presented the financial reports for the Association's general fund as well as each tournament. Russell Bunch, Springdale USBC, made a motion to accept the financials as presented subject to audit. Brenda Dokes, Pine Bluff USBC, 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. Motion carried.

Communications: Director Melissa Landers reported that the Arkansas State USBC Facebook page was a success and the website, [www.arkansasstateusbc.com](http://www.arkansasstateusbc.com), was being updated regularly. She is working with Michael Shirley and Kelly Stevens to get previous season tournament results uploaded and other important information added to the website. Our 2022-2023 tournament schedule, entry forms for events, tournament results, and resumes can be found on the website as they are available.

Charitable Fundraising: Director Debra Kent reported that the state board and members have done a great job of raising funds for BVL and Bowl for the Cure. 50-50 raffles, basket raffles, and a cross stitch created by Director Trudy Loerzel, were all used to raise funds. The Pine Bluff USBC donated many items for the baskets raffled at the Women's State Tournament. Debbie encouraged everyone to work hard to increase our donations for next season.

2022 USBC National Convention Report: 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President Dena Bunch reported that it was wonderful to see everyone in person at this year's convention. She and Michel Shirley were the elected delegates for the convention. She stated that the workshops were very educational and she encouraged the local associations to send delegates to the convention if possible. There is so much to learn from being around the other delegates and networking.

Youth Committee Report: Director Audra Holt reported that the Youth Committee had a great year. She thanked all of the league officials, local boards and members for their help and support. She stated that her full written report was included in the packet and didn't want to take up much time reading. She is excited for the upcoming season's events.

2021-2022 Calendar of Events: Director Trudy Loerzel presented the 2022-2023 tournament schedule to those in attendance. It was noted that the Youth Challenge and the Pepsi tournaments were on the schedule incorrectly. The dates were changed by the center to February 25, 2023, for the Challenge and February 26, 2023, for Pepsi.

Nominating Committee: Vanessa Burks, Central AR USBC, presented the slates for the 2022 elections. She stated that all resumes were received by the appropriate deadlines and were in order. Candidates are slated as follows: 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President-Trudy Loerzel. Director 2, District 1-Russell Bunch, incumbent. Director 5, District 3-no resumes. Director 8, District 4-Brenda Dokes, incumbent. Youth Director 11-Kelly Stevens, incumbent, and DeeDee Jeffery. USBC Convention Delegate-Dena Bunch, Audra Holt, Michael Shirley.

The meeting recessed at 3:PM and was called back to order at 3:50PM

Memorial: The names of our bowlers lost in the last year scrolled on the screen as What a Wonderful World played in the background.

Final Credentials Report: Sgt at Arms Audra Holt gave the final credential report. 3 Officers, 8 Directors, 42 Delegates giving 53 eligible to vote. There were 12 visitors in attendance.

David Fields, Michael Shirley and Kelly Stevens handed out the electronic voting machines as we awarded door prizes. The devices were tested and deemed ready to use.

Legislative: Director Russell Bunch presented the 3 proposed amendments for consideration.

---The first was in regards to adding Association Manger to the eligible list to serve as an officer of the ASUSBC. Audra Holt and Michael Shirley proposed the change. The proposed amendment would allow an Association Manager of a state association who had served a minimum of 3 years to run for office. Michael Shirley explained the reasons that it would open the pool of people eligible to run for an office and that the Association Manager is familiar with the operations of the association. 66% vote was needed to approve the amendment. The amendment was approved with a 98% for / 2% against vote. Actual votes were 46 for and 1 against the change.

---The 2<sup>nd</sup> proposed amendment was proposed by Michael Shirley and Audra Holt in regards to eliminating districts for director elections. Vacancies have been an ongoing issue and by eliminating the districts, this would allow the ASUSBC to fill the board of directors. 66% vote was needed to approve the amendment. The amendment was approved with 98% for / 2% against vote. Actual votes were 48 for and 1 against the change.

---The 3<sup>rd</sup> proposed amendment was proposed by Audra Holt, Michael Shirley and Melissa Landers in regards to the requirements to serve as director 9, 10, and 11. By adding the phrase "local association board member" to the requirement, this allows more people to be considered for these positions. 66% vote was needed to approve the amendment. The amendment was approved with 94% for / 6% against vote. Actual votes were 45 for and 3 against the change

2022 Elections: President Laura Childress started the 2022 elections.

- 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President. President Laura Childress presented the election of 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President . Incumbent Connie Lawrence is not seeking reelection. Trudy Loerzel was slated by the Nominating Committee. Nancy Burrow, Central AR USBC, made a motion to accept Trudy Loerzel by acclimation. Russell Bunch 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion carried.
- Director 2. Belinda Massey, Tri County USBC, made a motion to accept incumbent Russell Bunch by acclimation. Tena Ogle, Beaver Lake USBC, 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion carried.
- Director 5. President Laura Childress stated that there were no applications received for this position so this position will remain vacant but can be appointed.
- Director 8. Melissa Landers, Fayetteville USBC, made a motion to accept incumbent Brenda Dokes by acclimation. Emma Nelson, Pine Bluff USBC, 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion carried.
- Youth Director 11. President Laura Childress stated that incumbent Kelly Stevens and DeeDee Jeffery, Batesville USBC, had been slated by the Nominating Committee. Dawn Cringle, Tri County USBC, nominated Samantha Allgood, Tri County USBC, from the floor. President Childress stated that Samantha's resume was submitted on time and is eligible to run. Michael Shirley 2<sup>nd</sup>. This was a majority vote. Kelly Stevens was reelected with 54% (26 actual) votes, with DeeDee Jeffery receiving 27% (13 actual) and Samantha Allgood 19% (9 actual).

Russell Bunch, Springdale USBC, made a motion to fill the current vacancies with DeeDee Jeffery and Samantha Allgood. Tena Ogle, Beaver Lake USBC, 2<sup>nd</sup>. President Laura Childress stated that the vacancies would be filled by appointments and that she would take this into consideration.

- USBC Delegates 2023. President Laura Childress stated that 3 applications had been received for the Delegates to the 2023 USBC Convention. Dena Bunch, Audra Holt and Michael Shirley were seeking the 2 delegate positions. This will be a plurality vote. Michael Shirley received 45% (43 actual), Audra Holt 36% (34 actual) and Dena Bunch 19% (18 actual). Michael Shirley and Audra Holt will be our elected delegates to the USBC convention with Dena Bunch listed as an alternate.

Old Business/New Business: President Laura Childress asked if there was any Old or New Business to discuss.

Meeting adjourned at 4:46PM

2023 USBC Delegate Report**

To the ASUSBC Officers, Directors and Delegates:

The 2023 USBC Annual Convention and Meeting was held at South Point Convention Center in Las Vegas, NV on April 24-27, 2023. This year's theme was *Community Is Key*. Representing the ASUSBC was Michael Shirley and Audra Holt.

The convention was kicked off with registration and exhibits. The delegates were invited to visit a variety of exhibits, which included representatives from BVL, USBC Depts., and vendors.

The guest speaker was Vera Jones. She talked about "playing through the fouls" even when you are "blindsided". She is a very inspirational speaker and author.

There were several seminars to choose from. Some of the seminars that we attended included topics for SMART, Equipment, and Rules. The final seminar State of the Association was for everyone to get a recap on the financials and membership information.

We were able to meet the five candidates, who had been slated by the nominating committee to compete for three Director positions. Three of the candidates were incumbents and the other two candidates have been serving on their state boards.

The Annual Meeting was broken into 3 parts. The first part included bowling partner and committee reports in addition to introductions of the Hall of Fame inductees. The second part included national youth awards and scholarship presentations, the President and the Business reports. The third part included the Executive Report, Board Elections and the Legislative articles for voting.

The following amendments were approved by the delegates: 1) rewording of the USBC State Bylaws Article VII, Meetings, Section B. Board Meeting #4(b); 2) adding verbiage to the USBC Local Bylaws Article V, Board of Directors – Management, Section C. Election of Directors; 3) adding verbiage to the USBC Local Bylaws Article VI, Officers, Section B. Election; 4) rewording of the USBC Local Bylaws Article VII, Meetings, Section B. Board Meeting #4(b). The delegates rejected the proposed amendment for the USBC National Bylaws and all four of the proposed Rule changes.

Thank you for allowing us to represent Arkansas State USBC. We would like to encourage more local associations and young athletes to consider going to a future convention.

The Arkansas State USBC Hall of Fame Committee has again been very busy addressing a few issues on the applications and evaluation forms this season. As with any new program there will always be areas that need to be adjusted. This year the committee focused on redefining areas of the application and evaluation form for the Performance category and the evaluation forms for Meritorious Service and Star of Tomorrow. It feels like we take one step forward and two steps back. We are striving to be able to have qualified candidates nominated for the years that they have devoted to making bowling the number one sport and a sport for our future generations either in performance and or service. We will be working in the near future to develop another type of award for those that may not qualify for the Hall of Fame but need to be recognized for their energy and time that they have devoted on the local level.

During the luncheon today, we were able to induct Ronny Trusty from Batesville for Performance, Joy Peacock from Jonesboro, and Kurt Sij from Garfield for Meritorious Service. Gabby Heath from Vilonia was recognized for the Star of Tomorrow award.

For review purposes only, the purpose of the Hall of Fame is to recognize and honor adult members of the Arkansas State USBC for their outstanding achievements, conduct as a bowler or their service to the bowling community throughout the State.

To be eligible for the Performance and Meritorious categories, the nominee must be or have been an adult member of the Arkansas State USBC or one of its predecessors for a minimum of 15 years as an adult bowler. Must be at least 35 years of age as of August 1<sup>st</sup>. Must have demonstrated good sportsmanship and integrity both on and off the lanes and not have ever had their USBC membership suspended. Hall of Fame members from the previous Arkansas State BA and WBA has been grandfathered into the new Arkansas State USBC Hall of Fame.

The purpose of the Star of Tomorrow is to recognize and honor youth members of the Arkansas State USBC for their scholastic average, outstanding bowling achievements, conduct as a bowler and their service to the community.

To be eligible for the Star of Tomorrow, a nominee must have been, for the past five years, a member of a certified youth program in the state of Arkansas. They must be either a junior or graduating senior in high school in the current season. They must also provide a verified current 21 game average.

We encourage all local officers and board members to inform the bowlers of their association that these awards are available. Also, please encourage all bowlers to keep track of their own bowling history whether it be in performance, meritorious service, or Star of Tomorrow. We do ask that those individuals filling out an application for a nominee gather as much information as possible on that individual. The committee uses a point system in their evaluation. The more information received on the application will help the committee in its review, evaluation, and recommendation to the state board.

It is our goal to recommend the best individuals in our state for these prestigious awards.

The following is a summary of the meeting held on August 28, 2022. The recommendations were approved by the ASUSBC Board of Directors.

1. Reviewed and modified entries and rules for this season's youth tournaments: Youth Scratch Classic, Hill-Botter Memorial, Youth Challenge Handicap, Pepsi, and Youth Championship. Updates included tournament format, squads, dates, age division breakdowns and entry fee breakdowns.
2. Recommended additional changes to the Pepsi tournament. Elimination of advancement round, adjustment of game format, adjustment to tie breaker verbiage.
3. All youth tournaments will have squad times for the bowler/parent to select.
4. Recommended to add scholarship funds to the following tournaments from unassigned SMART funds: for Youth Scratch Classic - \$2,500; for Hill Botter Memorial - \$6,000; for Youth Challenge Handicap - \$5,500 (including the matching allotment assigned by USBC for Pepsi); for Pepsi - \$5,500 (including USBC Pepsi allotment); Youth Championship - \$10,000; Youth Adult Doubles - \$20 per entry based on a max of \$2,560.

The following is a summary of the meeting held on July 8, 2023.

1. Reviewed this season's tournament recaps.
2. Reviewed and discussed possible changes to the Youth Championship On-the-spot form
3. Discussed possible adding sportsmanship award to the youth tournaments for next season.
4. Discussed possible developing an academic scholarship application.
5. Discussed the youth pop-up tournaments for next season.
